# JUDITH JERGENSEN 1ST VICE PRESIDENT



The 85th Colorado Federation of Republican Women Convention and Board of Directors meeting provided us with much valuable information as we move forward to the 2024 elections. Our speakers included:

Ben Murray, Director of the Independence Institute's Fiscal Policy Center. He explained what Proposition HH really says, and gave us data to use to urge others to vote no on HH.

Representative Mike Lynch, House Minority Leader presented an update on the proceedings at the capitol this last session, and issued an impassioned plea to educate the electorate on the dangers of the lopsided super-majority control in the State government.

Steve Schleiker, El Paso County Clerk and Recorder spoke on Rank Choice Voting and how it could negatively affect elections and prevent the clear selection of a first choice winner.

Mark Waller, former State Representative and El Paso County Commissioner, explained what Dark Money is and how it is used. One simple example is the money collected through Small Donor Committees which can represent a very large contribution from multiple small donors.

Our Saturday dinner speaker was Debbie Georgatos, the host of "America, Can We Talk?" and a candidate for RNC National Committeewoman from Texas. She urged us to stand up for our beliefs and our freedoms. We cannot stay quiet any longer while our country is at risk.

As a special surprise, the founder of our Republican Party, President Abraham Lincoln and his wife, Mary Todd Lincoln, joined us. Mr. Lincoln addressed us and also offered an invocation. The Lincolns were a tangible reminder of who we were, and what we need to be.


October's meeting/program was a small panel of county officials discussing Proposition HH and Proposition II. The panel made initial comments and then took questions from the floor.
