Purpose: The purpose of the Mary Lane Award is to recognize the

achievement of the unit club which has best distinguished itself in the area of volunteer political hours contributed to the Republican

Party. This annual award was established to encourage Federation members to keep track of their unpaid volunteer political activity and through this award we assist NFRW in tracking the total number of non-paid political hours contributed

by Federation members across the nation.

History: This award was established by a strong advocate of political

volunteerism, Mary Lane, CFRW President for the 1976-78 term. Mary Lane's husband, Bill, purchased the silver bowl which is presented to the winning club each year. The first Mary Lane

Award was given in 1977.

Contest Criteria: The contest period runs from January 1 through December 31. In

accordance with the Standing rules, entries must be received by the CFRW Awards Chairman no later than two weeks prior to the

annual CFRW Board of Directors' meeting.

Contest Judging: The application for these awards shall be reviewed by the Awards

Committee with the assistance of other present or past officers of unit clubs, and will be validated by the Awards Chairman. These awards shall be given to the unit clubs which have the most NON-

PAID hours of political service per capita during the award

period.

Awards: First Place, Second Place, Third Place and Honorable Mention. A

traveling silver bowl accompanies the first place award and

remains with the winning club for one year.
