

14 tips for recruiting youths

Whether it's being tech-savvy or just something in the water, young people are willing to get involved in various endeavors, including nonprofit operations.

During the 14th annual Symposium for Nonprofit Professionals and Volunteers at the Axelson Center for Nonprofit Management at North Park University in Chicago, Mary Morten of the Morten Group offered the following tips for recruiting young people:

- Appoint a youth coordinator to take responsibility for young members.
- Set up a mentoring program within the organization, so all members have the opportunity to work with older/younger people and swap knowledge and skills.
- Set clear goals and guidelines so they understand their duties and fit within the organization.
- Adapt the organization's procedures when necessary to accommodate young people.
- Conduct orientation and screening so the needs of both the young person and the organization are met.
- Ensure all young members are aware of relevant health and safety laws.
- Make sure young members are aware of reporting structures, emergency plans, risk-management plans and the identity of their supervisor(s) so they can approach them if they have any suggestions/complaints/problems.
- Budget for any organizational change: training, etc.
- Sell the benefits of recruiting young people to all members.
- Appoint appropriate tasks to young people and don't place them in dangerous or difficult situations.
- Ask them what they want to do.
- Offer flexible jobs.
- Give their ideas a chance and allow them to act on their suggestions.

Ensure there is sufficient feedback and encouragement to maintain enthusiasm.

Meet Mary Howell, PhD, and Karen Mill, two dynamic women devoted to a single cause: making sure that every Student and educator has access to the Six Pages of the U. S. 


some children do not know what their rights are in America and where they came from. The answers are in these documents.

The first, largest, and most famous signature is that of John Hancock, President of the Continental Congress. The youngest signer was Edward Rutledge (age 26). Benjamin Franklin (age 70) was the oldest. Two future presidents signed: John Adams (second President) and Thomas Jefferson (third President).

Fate of the Signers of the Declaration of Independence

Five signers were captured by the British as traitors, and tortured before they died.

Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned. Two lost their sons serving in the Revolutionary Army; another had two sons captured.

Nine of the 56 fought and died from wounds or hardships of the Revolutionary War.

They signed and they pledged their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor. What kind of men were they?

Twenty-four were lawyers and jurists. Eleven were merchants, nine were farmers and large plantation owners; men of means, well educated. But they signed the Declaration of Independence knowing full well that the penalty would be death if they were captured.

Carter Braxton of Virginia, a wealthy planter and trader, saw his ships swept from the seas by the British Navy. He sold his home and properties to pay his debts, and died in rags.

Thomas McKeam was so hounded by the British that he was forced to move his family almost constantly. He served in the Congress without pay, and his family was kept in hiding. His possessions were taken from him, and poverty was his reward.

Vandals or soldiers looted the properties of Dillery, Hall, Clymer, Walton, Gwinnett, Heyward, Ruttledge, and Middleton.

At the battle of Yorktown, Thomas Nelson, Jr., noted that the British General Cornwallis had taken over the Nelson home for his headquarters. He quietly urged General George Washington to open fire. The home was destroyed, and Nelson died bankrupt.

Francis Lewis had his home and properties destroyed. The enemy jailed his wife, and she died within a few months.

ohn Hart was driven from his wife's bedside as she was dying. Their 13 children fled for their lives. His fields and his gristmill were laid to waste. For more than a year he lived in forests and caves, returning home to find his wife dead and his children vanished. A few weeks later he died from exhaustion and a broken

heart

Norris and Livingston suffered similar fates. Such were the stories and sacrifices of the American Revolution. These were not wild-eyed, rabble-rousing ruffians. They were soft-spoken men of means and education. They had security, but they valued liberty more. Standing tall, straight, and unwavering, they pledged: "For the support of this declaration, with firm reliance on the protection of the divine providence, we mutually pledge to each other, our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor."

Our For-Fathers fought to create the Declaration of Independence and gave their lives for the freedom and independence of America

ISIS and oil prices

Turmoil in the Middle East could tilt the field toward North American energy producers. By John Dowd Sector Portfolio Manager, Fidelity

Conflict has the potential to affect prices

- Military actions in Iraq have the potential to affect oil supplies.
- Limiting excess oil supply could magnify the impact of a disruption.
- Producers in North America could benefit.

During the past few months, Iraq has been destabilized anew by the rapid incursion of a Sunni militant group known as the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria (ISIS), which currently controls large sections of northern and western Iraq, including Mosul, Iraq's second-largest city, and the Baiji refinery. So far, the violence has not reached Iraq's southern oil fields, which produce most of its exports, but the risk of a significant disruption to Iraqi production could have a significant impact for stocks in the energy sector, and beyond.

While turmoil in oil-producing countries is nothing new, this situation is different for several reasons. First, the vulnerability of the global economy to disruptions varies over time, and there is currently very little excess global oil production capacity to provide a cushion in the event that Iraq's exports are cut off. During the past few years, Iraq has become the second-largest oil producer in OPEC, partly because of international sanctions against Iran and

instability in Libya. In June 2014, Iraq produced 3.17 million barrels per day, while OPEC's effective spare capacity is estimated at 3.25 million barrels per day (see chart below). If Iraq's production were to stop, there would be no spare capacity, and rising oil prices likely would slow global growth and energy consumption.

Longer term, Iraq has been expected to account for roughly 60% of the growth in OPEC production capacity until 2019 (see chart below), and the threat of disruption calls into question the nation's ability to meet those production targets. While no one can predict how the conflict will end, the possibility exists that Iraq's production will halt or slow, causing a spike in oil prices that impairs the global economy.

It's hard to view current developments in Iraq as positive for global supply growth, and markets are beginning to price in expectations for higher crude oil prices at the longer end of the curve. This could be beneficial for U.S. and Canadian energy producers, as they are buffered from the turmoil.

The North American shale oil and gas boom has been made possible by new techniques—hydraulic fracturing and horizontal drilling—that help producers extract oil and gas from shale rock. Adoption of these methods has fueled significant production growth during the past two years in the United States and Canada, which are now driving virtually all non-OPEC production growth (see the chart right).

Mideast turmoil further tilts the playing field toward higher-quality North American companies—those with limited debt, declining production cost structures, and the ability to grow production in the prime shale areas. These companies have been growing production volumes in the United States and increasing capital spending despite a relatively flat commodity price. Investors may be rewarded for owning the best-positioned companies, those with the ability to grow production and earnings independent of oil price fluctuation.



My biblical admonition of their youth was apparently written in their hearts, as they quoted in their lessons from mom, my oft-repeated words: "It would be better to have a millstone put around your neck and be dropped to the bottom of the sea than to give scandal to the little ones."



I trust my children are bringing up my twelve grandchildren in the way they should grow as responsible citizens who contribute and thank God every morning that they live in America, aka, they are bringing them up Republican. I have tried to follow my own motherly advice, and that is why, I suspect, I am recognized today.


