CENTENNIAL REPUBLICAN WOMEN

Remember always that all of us are descended from immigrants and revolutionists. Congress has complete constitutional power to decide who shall be admitted and under what conditions. Not until the 1880's did Congress begin to impose restrictions.

One of the big questions today is on the statement in the 14th Amendment "subject to the jurisdiction there of". Legal scholars and political scientists who have delved into history of this conclude it has no plain meaning and that the executive branch's current and broad application of the Citizenship Clause may not be warranted. In other words, what President Obama's doing is without congressional approval and therefore illegal.

On September 17, 2015, the Census Bureau finally released data from the survey of the US population as of July 1, 2014. This nation's immigrant population (legal & illegal) hit a record 42.4 million in July 2014.

Between 350,000 and 400,000 infants are born in the United States to illegal immigrants each year. Decades of oversight have produced many millions of such birthright citizens. Since these "anchor babies" immediately qualify as citizens for welfare benefits and public schooling the cost to American taxpayers is many billions of dollars per year

Not one European country now grants full citizenship automatically to a newborn whose parents have entered illegally.

Of the advanced economic countries only the United States and Canada recognize automatic birthright citizenship to children born to illegal aliens. Australia, Ireland, New Zealand, United Kingdom, Malta and the Dominican Republic have repealed their previous automatic citizenship policies of birthright citizens.

On January 22, 2016, Department of Homeland Security finally admits at least half-million foreign visitors overstayed visas in 2015 and feds are looking for them. This is finally being done nearly 20 years after Congress first requested it. The report gave no indication as to how many foreign visitors were still in the country after overstaying their visas from years before 2015. Only 3,000 visa overstays are currently under investigation. They are only examining business and tourist visas, but failed to get overstay data for students, guest workers, intra company transfers, exchange visitor, just to name a few.

MOUNTAIN REPUBLICAN WOMEN'S CLUB

Remember, Honor, Teach - December 12, 2015, Alamosa, Colorado, Homelake Veterans Cemetery

The Wreaths Across America mission is to *Remember, Honor, Teach*, and is carried out in part by coordinating wreath laying ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery and other veterans' cemeteries throughout the country. The ceremony this year at Homelake Cemetery resulted in ~1,100 wreaths placed on our veterans' gravesites. The wreaths were delivered from Maine by the National Carriers Trucking Service free of charge. The driver stated, "This is our way of honoring and remembering all the veterans who sacrificed so much for our freedom."

The Homelake State Veterans Center was established in 1889 as the Soldiers' and Sailors' Home, and is listed on the Colorado Register of Historic Properties. The mission of Homelake was to provide a peaceful



and comfortable home for retiring Civil War and Spanish-American War veterans. Many of the historic buildings are still in use today as the retirement center. The cemetery dates to the Civil War and is the oldest veterans' cemetery in Colorado.

The San Luis Valley chapter of the Colorado Federation of Republican Women (SLVRW) has been active for the past several years with the purchase of wreaths in honor of local and other veterans who are buried in the area. In December 2015, the SLVRW again donated funds to purchase 5 wreaths, and numerous others were purchased by individual member contributions.
