

As you send your membership lists into Dona Troyer our CFRW Treasurer be sure to include the entire club name and not initials. We have several clubs that have the same initials. and it is hard sometimes to determine which club you are paying membership for. We need the name of the member, her mailing address, telephone number and email. When you send the mailing address be sure to include your zip codes. It also helps if you send the zip code+4. You can find the last 4 numbers of the zip code by going to www.usps.com and the click on Zip Code. You will have to type in the address and the zip code plus 4 will be shown. If you don't look them up I will because it will save NFRW and CFRW money on postage if we have the entire zip code. On Telephone numbers be sure to include the area code. All of this just makes is easier as I am entering the membership into the NFRW Data Base and also the CFRW Data Base. I will not be able to attend all of the District Meetings. I have planned on doing this until I fell and broke my hip right after Board Meeting in March. I am doing fine but just can't to everything that I would like to do.
